SCHOOL TOURS GUIDELINES

A visit to The GRAMMY Museum is an exciting experience!

Please review guidelines with students and chaperones prior to arriving at the Museum.

Arriving at the Museum

Arrive on time for a good time!

When planning your trip to the Museum, please allow extra time for unseen traffic, unloading buses and bathroom breaks before your tour begins. Late arrivals will cut down on the time your group is able to tour the Museum.

Put names on all sack lunches

Please make sure each student has his or her name on their sack lunch upon arrival at the Museum. We will collect lunches prior to your group's entrance and hold them until students are ready to eat.

Leave backpacks and other items on the bus (except headphones!)

Please have students leave all backpacks, purses, bags, cell phones, pens, markers and other valuables on the bus when visiting the Museum. Because our exhibits are hands-on and sometimes require visitors to stand in enclosed areas, the more room each person has the more enjoyable their experience will be. There are additional plugs in most interactive exhibits for personal headphones, so students bring those along.

General Museum Visit Guidelines

Chaperones must stay with students at all times

Chaperones are responsible for making sure students adhere to Museum guidelines as well as maintain an appropriate level of behavior and conduct. School groups are required to bring one (1) adult for every ten (10) students. Chaperones are required to stay with their designated students during the entire tour. Please make sure all chaperones are aware of the Museum's guidelines prior to your visit.

Food and beverage prohibited in the Museum

Food, beverages, chewing gum and candy are not allowed in The GRAMMY Museum. Museum staff will direct you to designated areas where lunches can be eaten if indicated on the reservation form.

No photography in the Museum

The GRAMMY Museum is a hands-on music experience and we invite you to learn about exhibit content in an engaging way, however, in order to preserve the integrity of our artifacts, we ask students to refrain from any photography.

Keep on schedule!

The GRAMMY Museum contains three floors of interactive exhibits, designed to be touched and explored. That being said, students and chaperones are asked to please keep on schedule while visiting the Museum to ensure everyone receives the full experience of our exciting Sound Stage programs. Plan to spend a maximum of 20-30 minutes per floor.

We know students will walk away inspired about learning through music! Have fun, sing in the sound booth, lay down a rap, and dance to our performers in the Sound Stage. Students won't realize they will be exploring history, social studies, politics, science and English language arts as part of The GRAMMY Museum experience.
