Exhibit includes:

40-plus framed photographs

Exhibit text panels

Descriptive placards for each photograph

Original video footage of photographers discussing the photographs

Exhibit size requirements:

Exhibit must be presented in a secure, climate-controlled exhibit gallery

Five video screens necessary within gallery space

Appropriate, museum-quality lighting in gallery required

Insurance:

Host institution required to provide a certificate of insurance and a copy of the institution's facility report before exhibit ships

Fees:

In addition to the rental fee, host institution is responsible for paying prorated shipping cost (one direction of shipping) and travel costs for two GRAMMY Museum staff members for installation and de-installation
